DAY TIME

1 AT THE WHITE HOUSE

LOCAL TIP

Open: Tue - Sat
Park Sonsbeek is a must-see for anyone visiting Arnhem. It's the largest city park in Europe and it's just a five minute walk away. This gives it a special place in my heart. Younger (and older) people meet each other around the White Villa on hot summer evenings. They come here to eat, read, play games, and – of course – to enjoy the beautiful view of the city. The park is large enough to experience some peace and relaxation that the busy nature of the city doesn't afford you. Reading a book by the water or in the middle of the photogenic woods can help you relax (personal favourite) and the lovely Steile Tuin should not be overlooked. This garden loops uphill via a series of stairs with plenty of room to sit down. In winter, when it's cold enough, the park transforms into a fairy tale. Ice skates and sleds are taken out of the closet, and there's much talk about the beautiful white landscape. I recommend everyone not to skip this place!

2 MULTIFUNCTIONAL MEETING PLACE

Open: Mon - Sat

If you want to be bombarded with cultural experiences, **Rozet** is the place to be! The building itself is already quite the sight and won the award for building of the year in 2014 as voted by Dutch architects. It contains a public library but also houses an archaeological centre and all kinds of cultural workshops and courses. Upstairs there's even a clothes library and a terrace that offers great views of the city. All in all it's a great place to spend the day if you're a real 'cultuursnuffer' (culture sniffer), as we like to call it.

3 PUT A RECORD ON

Open: Mon - Sat

Located along one of the main shopping streets of Arnhem, record store **Kroese** is easy to find. Especially when Kroese is hosting one of their occasional in-store concerts. Then the melodies of (locally) known musicians spill out of the store into the streets. Relive old times or get to know new sounds while testing out records in this vibey store, which is of course better than their branch in Nijmegen.

4 BETTER THAN THE SPA

Open: Wed - Sat

Feeling stressed? Not good for you. Yes? Welcome to the club! **Bleu Art Gallery** has the ultimate solution for our stressed-out minds and bodies: smashing tableware. Yes, you read that right. Annoying teachers, mean bosses, rude family members... Nobody's bad vibes can withstand the power of smashing plates into a wall. We promise, it works better than the spa.

5 MOM'S FAVOURITE COFFEE


Open: daily

9 DON'T TELL ANYONE

Open: Tue - Sat

It pains us to share our favourite second hand store with you, at the risk of our little gem getting discovered by everyone. That's how much we like you. The beautifully organised **Reshairs Store** is our favourite second hand clothing store for various reasons. Not only because you can scrounge through both second hand and vintage clothing, but also because the place has exceptionally reasonable prices! On top of that, all proceeds of Reshairs go to the Salvation Army. That way a visit to the shop doesn't only help you get a stylish new wardrobe, but also helps fellow human beings.



10 READING IN THE RAIN

Open: daily

Since a vacation is never complete without a visit to a local bookstore, we could not recommend **Colofon** enough. They have a wide-ranging collection of books and everything book-related. For us the highlight is upstairs, where you'll find a whole second hand section and (semi) discounted books. This store can keep you snooping for quite some time, so it's the perfect place to spend a fairly day!

11 LOAD UP YOUR VINTAGE COLLECTION

Open: daily

There are plenty of vintage and second-hand stores scattered throughout the city centre, but this is one of the biggest (and to be honest, also a bit more expensive). **Eabrits & More** offers no less than 300 square metres filled with vintage clothing, all paid for by the kilo. Rummage through the collection of men's and women's fashion, shoes and accessories.

12 FABRICS, FLOWERS AND FOOD

Every Friday and Saturday morning, the marketplace near the Eusebius church is transformed into a chaotically organised **Market** where you can get all your fresh produce, flowers, and more! Tradition states that you've got to get Kibbeling (fried fish) with *Reijgertsaus* or fresh raw herring with onion. On Fridays the market is packed with stalls for fabrics and sewing equipment, so be sure to check that out if you like creating your own apparel.

13 HANG OUT WITH HORSES


On the floodplains south of the Rhine river you can find **Meinestrijik**. In this park, nature has blended with traces of centuries of human activity in the form of a Roman castellum, a brickworks factory, and WWII bunkers. In between these ruins, nature has free reign to do however she pleases. When taking a break from exploring the area, the river banks offer a perfect spot to relax and dip your feet into the water (never go too deep as the river is very unpredictable). Beware though, as the wild (but gentle) horses that roam the area definitely do not care about your personal space.



14 THE GREAT DUTCH MOUNTAINS

Open: daily, €11,50

TOURIST INFORMATION

TOURIST OFFICE

You can find the tourist information office inside the Eusebius Church. They're open every day besides Sunday from 10:00 till 17:00. The Visit Arnhem website however, is open 24/7! Go to: www.visitarnhem.com

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

To use public transport, we recommend getting an OV chip card for €7,50 at the central station (valid on all public transport). You can top it up at the yellow ticket machines and it must contain at least €4 for buses and €20 for trains. You can also get single, slightly more expensive tickets for buses from the bus driver (no cash!). To plan your journey, the best app to use is 9292.

DINNER TIME

Dutchies are early eaters. We have our dinner at around 18:00, which is rather early compared to countries with warmer climates. Beware that restaurant kitchens often close before 21:00.

EMERGENCY NUMBER

The emergency phone number for the police, ambulance or fire department is 112.



MONEY

The most common payment method is by debit card. Some places don't even accept cash anymore, so make sure that you always have both cash and a debit or credit card on you. ATMs are widely available and are shown on the map.

DRUGS POLICY

Drugs are illegal in the Netherlands, but the use of cannabis by people over 16 is tolerated. If you want to try it, there are a few things to keep in mind. You are only allowed to buy it at registered coffeeshops and cannot carry more than 5 grams on you at any time. While smoking in the street is tolerated, it is generally frowned upon. Be mindful of others and choose an appropriate space.

6 ARNHEM'S DAILY BREAD

Open: Tue - Sat
 This tiny little bakery was founded in 1904. After WWII Het Arnhemse Bakkerie started making *profies*: bread buns with raisins. *Grofjes* were cheaper than the popular *Arnhemboel* (courant buns) and therefore very popular amongst the masses who were impoverished after the war. That was a long time ago, but *profies* are still a popular treat in Arnhem. We promise their popularity has very little to do with their price!

7 ICONIC FRIES

Open: daily
 Okay, it doesn't look like much from the outside. But looks can be deceiving, because **Hebboek** is the most famous chip shop in and around Arnhem. This is most definitely due to the freshly cut skin-on potatoes and the broad variety of mayonnaises (including the one with truffle in it!) Eating the chips from a paper cone whilst walking through the city centre is one of the typical local activities you simply must not miss out on when visiting Arnhem.

8 HEBBEDINGETJES

Open: Wed - Sat
 Looking for a souvenir? A nice postcard for your grandma? Or a unique decoration for your home? In Dutch, we call these things *hebbedingetjes*. You'll find plenty of them in **Bos En Help**, a creative concept store in the cosy '70strafjes'. The products in this packed shop are selected with the utmost care: from pieces designed by independent local artists to sustainable brands you won't find in regular stores. This makes Bos en Help the perfect place for typical Arnhem souvenirs. Don't forget to secretly buy yourself a little present. You deserve it!

15 PORTUGUESE DELIGHTS



Open: daily
Bomboca is a Portuguese coffee bar located in Spijkerkwartier. It has a friendly-neighborhood atmosphere. 
16 THE HIDDEN CRAFT BEER TEMPLE

Open: Tue - Sat
 When our great-grandparents bought their first beer in the 1900s, **Silfired Van Pennis** was already a household name. More than 1200 different kinds of craft beer stood there on the shelves, patiently waiting to be discovered. The dorm-room-meets-warehouse layout of the store hasn't changed much over the years. With both affordable and exclusive beers, Silfired van Pennis is still ready to support the next generation in the quest for alcohol!



17 HIDDEN OASES

The Spijkerkwartier neighbourhood boasts multiple volunteer-run **Public Gardens** that are open to the public. They're not widely known (one might even say they're a bit of a secret) and some of them are hidden quite well. You can recognise them by grey plaques on the sidewalk, so try a little scavenger hunt! Arnhemmers come to the gardens to read a book, enjoy the scenery, have a picnic or just to spend some quality time alone or with friends. Remember to treat the gardens with care, because they were created with a lot of love.



18 SELL IT YOURSELF

Open: Mon - Sat
leader Zinn Winkels is a hybrid of a thrift store and a flea market. Local sellers can reserve a stand and offer their items for sale often for very low prices. This results in a nice mixture of second hand clothing, vintage home decor, hand made objects and even inexpensive food. Sellers only rent their stands for a couple of weeks, so there's always something new to be found!


19 WE'LL MAKE BREAKFAST

ART, HISTORY AND CULTURE

A AIRBORNE AT THE BRIDGE

Open: daily, free entrance
 Airborne at the Bridge is a small annex of the Airborne Museum which tells the story of the violent Battle of Arnhem at the Rhine river in 1944, an important part of the liberation of Europe during World War II.

B COLLECTIE DE GROEN

Open: Thu - Sun
 Located in a beautiful former bank and conservatory, Collectie de Groen is a new cultural hotspot in the city centre. In 2017, an artistic couple bought the place and turned it into a display of their private collection. The ground floor exposition is free, but a tour of the extended private collection is also possible for only €10. There are also parties, performances, quizzes and more. You can check their website, or just be spontaneous!

C GALLERY TWAALHOUVEN

Open: Sat
 Gallery Twaalhouven is an art gallery that specialises in neo-street pop art. The paintings have an iconic figure at its centre, worn-out as if on an old billboard. The result is a potpourri of fun colour and typography. Be sure to visit the gallery to check out current exhibitions!

D MOLEN DE KROON

Open: Fri, Sat
 A trip to The Netherlands is not complete without visiting a traditional windmill. In the heart of the Klarendal neighbourhood, Molen De Kroon is open for visitors to explore its inner workings and history. Next to the mill, there's an exhibition space that highlights the work of a different local artist every month.

E BRONBEEK

Open: daily, €6

Now that the city is opening up after the covid-lockdowns, we can finally indulge in art and culture again! And as the home base of ArHEZ art academy, Arnhem has a lot to offer in this area. Whether you like (modern) art, history or science, we know some places you will love.

F DUTCH OPEN AIR MUSEUM


Open: daily, €19,50
 The best place to learn about Dutch history and simultaneously experience it is the Dutch Open Air Museum. In this huge park you'll find iconic Dutch architecture and you can ride a classic streetcar, all the while munching on delicious traditional snacks. The museum is especially wonderful in winter (there when there's an ice rink, a sledding hill and loads of hot chocolate). There are campfires to keep you warm and a winter market to buy some interesting souvenirs. We promise you won't be bored (or cold).

G WATERMUSEUM

Open: Tue - Sun, €11,50
 The 18th century watermill turned interactive museum teaches you everything about the Dutch water systems and our love-hate relationship with water. How can we protect ourselves against rising water levels? How do we keep drinking water clean? These and many more questions will be answered during your visit to the picturesque building at the foot of Sonsbeek park.

H MUSEUM ARNHEM

Open: Tue - Sun, €15
 As of May 2022, we can finally enjoy our modern art museum again after 5 years! And it was worth the wait. The exhibitions are carefully thought out, with respectful handling of controversial subjects. The sculpture garden has also been improved, making it a lovely place for a stroll in the sun, with an amazing view of the river. The sculpture garden is freely accessible, while the museum itself costs 5 euros for students, so bring your student card!

Skateboarding? We know it's a niche, but we couldn't let our skateboarding buddies down. Moreover, we need to celebrate that skateboarding is now officially an Olympic sport! The **Public Skateshop** offers everything you need when it comes to (custom made) boards, shoes, clothing and accessories. It'll all help you look fly whilst flying through the air after a failed kickflip. Need to take a day off to give your body some rest? The owner hosts exhibitions and screenings of skateboard videos he has collected since the 00s. Check their website for upcoming events!

22 CONSCIOUS SHOPPING

Open: Tue - Sat

Battling child abuse and stimulating buying second hand items rather than new ones: this is what **Terre Des Hommes** stands for. Well, mainly the battling of child abuse. Selling used items is more of a means to an end, but this makes the concept all the better for the world we live in. They have about 40 stores in the Netherlands, together making over 1 million euros a year to support children all over the world. Also, they have some pretty good and inexpensive stuff, ranging from clothes to furniture. Happy shopping!

23 LITERARY DRINKS


Open: Tue - Sun

Libertas is the only literary café in Arnhem: it's a small oasis in the Klerendal neighbourhood where you can dream away with one of the second hand books on the shelves, work in peace, or have a good coffee or beer with friends. They work with a bring-your-own-food system, so you can enjoy your favourite meal while enjoying the sun on the garden terrace. As soon as you walk in an atmosphere of peace washes over you. Love hanging around here all day, studying and reading books, then playing one of the many games of the shelves with my friends in the evening. **Libertas** also organises several activities during the week, from vintage markets to live music or the monthly game-night. 24 BRONBEEK

Open: daily, €6

The **Bronbeek Royal Home for Retired Military Personnel** was founded in 1863. Today it is both a retirement home for veterans as well as a museum about the complex colonial and military past of The Netherlands, mainly in Indonesia. The indoor museum is temporarily closed until mid-2023, but the outdoor estate is freely accessible and a nice place for a walk. There are thought-provoking outdoor exhibitions and varying public activities. We also recommend eating Indonesian food at the **Kumpulian** restaurant.

25 SONSBEEK'S QUIET NEIGHBOUR

Park Zypendaal is arguably one of the most beautiful parts of Arnhem. Unfortunately, it is often overshadowed by its famous neighbour, **Sonsbeek park**. Now, we all love **Sonsbeek**, but if you're looking for a little more peace and quiet, **Zypendaal** is the place to go. The grand castle in the valley was once owned by **Audrey Hepburn's** grandfather. On warm summer days we love coming to the castle to have a picnic and then fall asleep in the grass. But **Zypendaal** is wonderful in any season. For example, the turning leaves in autumn make this park even more magical than it already is.



26 A DAY IN NATURE

Open: daily

Wildlife, heath, forests and sand drifts. Not what you would expect to find on a city trip. But that's exactly what makes Arnhem so special. **National Park De Hoge Veluwe** was created over a century ago by **Anton and Helene Kröller-Müller**, to combine nature and art for the common good. Art, you say? Yes, right in the middle of the park you'll find the

respectful handling of controversial subjects. The sculpture garden has also been improved, making it a lovely place for a stroll in the sun, with an amazing view of the river. The sculpture garden is freely accessible while the museum itself costs 5 euros for students, so bring your student card!

27 AIRBORNE MUSEUM HARTENSTEIN

Open: daily, €15

This museum is technically not located in Arnhem, but it's so special that we still want to recommend it. The **Airborne Museum** is the only museum that tells the history and socio-cultural story of the Battle of Arnhem, a story that lives on in every Arnhemmer. So, if you want to fully immerse yourself in the local experience, this museum is a must.

28 CITY SAFARI

Open: daily, €23.50 (book in advance)

Always wanted to go on safari? This may sound strange, but in Arnhem you're in the right place. North of the city centre you'll find **Burgers' Zoo**. This place is one of a kind because of all of the indoor biomes they created: an ocean, desert, mangrove and a bush (including a huge waterfall). A trip around the world was never this cheap! The well-being of the animals is the zoo's first priority. They have a strong focus on the protection of endangered species and truly care about conservation and sustainability. Dare we say **Burgers' Zoo** is the best zoo in The Netherlands? Yes, we do.

Kröller-Müller Museum, with the second largest collection of Vincent van Gogh works in the world. Other famous modern artists like **Monet, Picasso** and **Mondrian** are also displayed here. To get to the park entrance, you'll have to take a trip outside the city centre, and pay an entrance fee for both the park and the museum (50% discount for students), but we promise your time and money won't be wasted.

5 minutes of history

Hi, my name is Eusebius. Nice to meet you! At 93 metres, I am Arnhem's tallest church. That's why the locals like to call me the Big Church.

I was born in 1452, when my ninth-century predecessor was squashed and I was built on top of the ruins. I'm named after martyr Saint Eusebius, who kept talking even after they cut out his tongue!

I was shining bright as a catholic church until 1579, which is longer than most of my friends. However, I too fell victim to protestant raids. They removed all of my interior: statues, altars, paintings... Frankly, it left me feeling quite empty.

They tried to fill that void in 1650, when I was given "The Lantern", a tower 96 metres tall. And to be honest, that was a nice gesture. I'd never be taller than this! I grew quite fond of my new caretakers, who maintained me for centuries. One time it took 36 years to fix me up until 1930! They just about fixed my tower, when the German invasion started in 1940.

I managed to stay upright during this wretched war, until 1944. One afternoon I saw thousands of men dangling on parachutes whirling from the sky, coming closer and closer. So the Germans bombed the city's bridge and accidentally set me on fire as well! Can you believe that?! I was entirely in ruins, along with half the city.

In 1945, when the war was over, those crazy Arnhemmers came back and celebrated their freedom by hosting an open air play. On top of me! On the debris they called it. At least they built me back up afterwards.

During my most recent maintenance session in the 2010s, I was kept under covers and I couldn't see a thing for 10 whole years. When they finally revealed me, the square in front had been renamed after this address: Audrey Hepburn, who lived in Arnhem for a brief moment during the war.

My new look in 2022 is much more contemporary. From the new glass balconies you can view the entire city like I see it every day and as of this year you can once again visit my dungeons, which are comfortably spooky.

NIGHT TIME

27 CAFE BAR NELSON

Open: Tue - Sun

Local tip

Situated next to the Nelson Mandela bridge, you can find Nelson Bar Restaurant. Nelson is well known for its originality in music, guests and food. It is also well known for its living-room feel because the cafe was built in two regular houses. During daytime I often come here to enjoy a tasty coffee in the back garden or in the sunroom. Every Wednesday and Thursday evening you can enjoy jam sessions and on weekends there's a large variety of events, from poetry evenings to Brazilian music nights. Don't forget your dancing shoes!

28 CINEMA FOR DANCING

Luxor Live opened her legendary doors in 1915 as Luxor-Theatre. At that time it was the fanciest cinema in Arnhem. During the 70s things changed and in 1984 Luxor was reborn as a cultural youth centre, hosting memorable concerts by rock bands like Van Halen and The Fall. These days Luxor's calendar is filled with big as well as small names, themed dance nights and music quizzes. Check the agenda online.

29 AN IRISHMAN IN ARNHEM

The Mick O'Connell's Irish Pub is everything you would expect from an Irish pub. From the typical name to the brown interior design, the pool table and the television screens constantly streaming rugby and football matches. The former smoking area is now a cosy room filled with couches and board games. So grab an Irish beer or snack and bear your friends at 30 Seconds!

30 BECAUSE I GOT HIGH



Squeezed in between the commercial shops of the main shopping streets, the bright green-yellow facade of the Fresh Food Corner is not to be missed. Here you'll find a lively family business where you can get fresh Indian-Pakistani street food. You pay €7.50 for a chicken or vegan curry, and even less for the tastiest Naan, Pakoras and Samosas. Take a bubble tea on the side, and off you go!

32 POOL (NOT FOR SWIMMING)

At Taphys you can tap your own drinks from the wall, with around 100 beers and 80 wines to choose from. It's easy: get a card, charge it, then scan it at the tapping wall. A pro tip: this place is quite expensive, so pour small amounts of beer or wine to do a little tasting.

34 A SET MENU

Open: Tue - Sat
Enig Alternatief is a place you must have visited at least once. This small diner serves vegetarian and organic food that you can take away or eat in their cosy and vintage-looking living room. If you go here there's no need to be a good decision maker, for there is only one dish on the menu which differs every day. If you don't finish your meal, the owner will gladly pack up the leftovers, so you can enjoy every last bite in your own time.



35 SMALL INDONESIA

Open: Wed - Sun
Right at the heart of the Zewen Straatjes is where you can find the small but perfect Indonesian restaurant **Rasaasari**. This is the perfect place for comfort food, as it has been for about 50 years! You can get a quick take-away - like fried tempoh - as a quick snack, or sit down at a table. Moreover, you can buy all your basic cooking requirements, like homemade sambal, if you feel like taking a little piece of this magical place home.



36 PLANT BASED TWO WAYS

Open: Thur - Sun
A definite must for plant-based food lovers is the newest venture by Studio Konijnenvoer (translated as rabbit food). At their current location these entrepreneurs have opened not one, but two restaurants. On the ground floor **De Chique Zakk** offers a high-end / course vegan experience. If you want something a little more budget-friendly, head downstairs to **Tastotria 89** where Italian classics are given a new interpretation.

37 EXPERIMENTAL PLAYS

Open: Tue - Thur
Although the name suggests otherwise, this theatre is not actually along the Rhine river. But located right in the city centre it's close enough. **Theater AID Film** is an experimental, atmospheric place for all kinds of art. From fashion shows to urban dance and everything in between, you can find it here. Bartok Park outside the theatre is a cosy oasis with picnic tables and lots of greenery, and there is a supermarket right across the street to get some affordable drinks or snacks to enjoy.

38 FRIETOLOGY

Open: Tue - Sun
We are in love with the Frietologie. It's the archetype of a Dutch snackbar, with all the classic fried snacks. Next to that, the owner of this place is a real **Arnhemmer** and entrepreneur who supports anyone's appetite: the extensive menu contains plenty of vegetarian and vegan snacks! At last, everyone can enjoy Dutch fast food classics such as **kroketten** and **frikandelien**. If you eat in, you'll be served as if at a fancy restaurant, with cutlery and all, and the owner is always up for a nice chat.

39 CLASSIC ARTHOUSE MOVIES

Open: daily
Visit Focus Filmtheater if you are in the mood for an art house film. Ticket prices vary from €9,50 (Monday-Friday before 18:00) to €10,50 (Weekends). Students receive a €2,50 discount. Attending one of the open air screenings on the roof in the summer is an absolute must. Focus also has a nice restaurant with a view of Audley Heppum square. Notice the void with the big staircase in the middle of the building: this is a modern reconstruction of the Medieval alley that used to be here.

40 A WORLD OF FOOD

Open: Tue - Sun
From Japanese sushi to Arabic Mezza, at the **Foodhall** you can try all different kinds of cuisines. The dishes from various stands are perfect for shared dining and you can order them in a breeze through an app on your phone. During the summer they set up **Rose's Beach** on the quay, including a small swimming pool. From there you get a perfect view of the Rhine river.

41 BEACH BOYS 'N GIRLS

Open: daily, in summer
A beach in the middle of the city? No, you're not in Barcelona (sorry). From April to October, the southern riverbank of the Rhine is transformed into **Strand Zuid**. With sand everywhere, a beach bar, seats made out of sea crates, a wooden deck, toilets in shipping containers, music and regularly organised events, this is where summer-life reaches its full potential. Good to know: on rainy or cold days the beach could be closed. Check the website for up-to-date information!





46 FERMENTED FEASTS


Open: Wed - Sat


